ANNUAL REPORT - FYE 2021

Mission

Empowering people with disabilities to develop skills for independence and to actively participate in the community.

Programs and Services

LifeBridge Partnership's overriding philosophy is to provide opportunities for children and adults with disabilities to live full, productive lives. In 2021, we provided 5,716 unit hours of service, which was a 64% increase over 2020. We realized a 20% increase in accessible one-way trips, providing more than 2,200 trips in 2021. LifeBridge provides support services to clients through a variety of community based recreational programs and activities:

- Participants, rather than observers. Using adaptive equipment and techniques, children participate in a variety of sporting and recreational activities such as basketball, golf, dance, music and art therapy. Activities also include experiential learning activities such as a behind the scenes tour of the St. Louis Zoo or exploring a pirate ship. LifeBridge offers two camps in the summer, a Winter Break Camp in late December, and a Spring Break Camp in March.
- After School Services are offered in partnership with St. Louis Public Schools. LifeBridge Leaders Club is held two days per week. The main goals of LifeBridge Leaders Club are to promote the development of soft skills for employment and for them to experience a sense of belonging. Students participate in two hours of enrichment activities, soft skill classroom instruction and team building activities. The students also visit workplaces to learn about job opportunities and practice soft skills with hiring managers.
- The Out & About program provides adults with individualized support services to assist with building skills for independence and experiencing an inclusive community life. In cooperation with LifeBridge staff, participants initiate and coordinate recreational and educational activities at venues throughout the St. Louis metropolitan area. Through these activities participants develop skills to navigate the community, socialize in a community-based setting, and self-advocate.
